Ice Breaker

Do you tend to see the little details or the big picture?

Read

Acts 3:1-10; 2 Corinthians 6:10; Isaiah 55:6; Leviticus 21:16-19

Main Points

- 1. In the 3.5 years of Jesus' ministry he had over 40 one-on-one encounters with people.
- 2. Our expectation primes our brain to comprehend an event or interpret a picture in a certain way.
- 3. Jesus was able to see through all the exterior facade, he saw through people's reputation, their motives, and he saw their real need before they even saw it.
- 4. Though Peter and John had seen the crippled man daily, in Acts 3 they finally *saw* him through Jesus' eyes and then their words and actions followed.
- 5. God's presence isn't just for us to experience, it's for us to share as well.
- 6. We go as sent ones seeing people differently through the lends of Jesus that saw us differently.

Group Discussion

- Do you remember when you first realized that God sees you differently than how others saw you? Or how you saw/see yourself?
- How does being *sent* impact what we see?
- Who might be someone/people that you pass by every day that God is inviting you to see differently?

Bottom Line

Living a *Sent Life* is to see people through the eyes of the one who has sent you.
