Opener

How would you describe your understanding of God's will for your life?

Read

1 Peter 3:18-4:6; 1 Peter 1:11; 2 Peter 2:4-5; Eph 4:8-9; Col 2:14-15; 2 Timothy 2:11-12

Main Points

- 1. There are three main views on the text in 1 Peter 3:18-20 (a) Decent into Hell, (b) Pre-Incarnate Christ, (c) Triumphal Proclamation
- 2. Regardless of which view you embrace personally, the point of all three is that it point to a the glorious and victorious Christ!
- 3. Legalism forbids what God allows, license allows what God forbids, the gospel is about a whole new sphere of life called grace. It's not somewhere in the middle between legalism and license, it's entirely different.
- 4. There are two definitions of grace in the New Testament: (a) forgiveness, acceptance, unmerited favor and (b) divine enablement. The same grace that saves us is the same grace that enables us to live a transformed life!

- What does it mean to you, that grace is not only for salvation, but the divine enablement to live a transformed life?
