Sermon Questions for 12.19.2021*

## **Opener**

When have you seen power and compassion on display from the same person, for the benefit of others?

## **Read**

Isaiah 9:6; Isaiah 61:1-2; 1 Corinthians 1:18; Ephesians 6:10; John 1:3; Colossians 1:15-17; John 17:3; 1 John 5:11-12; Psalm 103:13-14, 17

## **Main Points**

1. *El Gibor* denotes the strength of a warrior, most accurately translated to “Warrior God.” God is mighty like a warrior. He’s the one who fights and wins our battles.
2. The cross, not a spear, became the chosen instrument of this warrior God, a Mighty God. Because Jesus is your Mighty God, you don’t have to be mighty.
3. Jesus is the Father of forever and he Fathers you forever.
4. He fights our battles, and he picks us up when we are wounded. He is clothed with majesty and yet he looks at you with mercy and compassion.

## **Engage with God in a Group**

- Why is it important that Jesus is described as “mighty God” and “father of forever”?
- What thoughts go through your mind when you think about him *fathering you forever*?
- How is your understanding of the circumstances in your life impacted by the reality that Jesus is mighty and compassionate, that he fights and wins your battles?
- When have you realized you could trust him to not only be powerful, but kind and trustworthy in your own life?

## **Bottom Line**

Nothing can stand against us because he is Mighty God and nothing can separate his love from us because he is an Everlasting Father.
