*Week 6: The Samaritan Woman | Teacher: Libin Abraham
Sermon Questions for 2.13.2022*

Opener

If you could have a one-on-one dinner with Jesus, where would you want to go and what would be your first question for him?

Read

John 4:3-6; John 4:7-30; Isaiah 58:11; John 4:39

Main Points

1. When John says that Jesus “had to go through Samaria,” this wasn’t a physical imperative, but a spiritual imperative, a personal one...he had to go through Samaria because he was pursuing a person.
2. Jesus crossed racial, ethnic, social, gender, and religious lines to meet with the Samaritan woman. Jesus pursued her for her - he saw her as a person in great need.
3. Jesus is not a well we approach, he is the well that approaches us.
4. Not only did the Samaritan woman believe, she immediately became an evangelist - she didn’t try to explain Jesus, she invited people to experience Jesus.

Engage with God in a Group

- How have you understood the story of the woman at the well?
- What was something new that you gleaned from the message about the interaction between Jesus and the Samaritan woman? Why is that significant?
- If you were to share your story of faith in Jesus, what would you say?
- What is your biggest struggle in sharing your faith?
- What are the things that you’re holding onto that feel more valuable than taking that next step of faith to share with someone in your life?

Bottom Line

All it takes is one conversation with Jesus to be radically transformed and immediately sent.
