Week 2: Stay in the Story | Teacher: Libin Abraham Sermon Questions for 3.6.2022

Opener

If you could actually be inside a story that you've read, what story would you want to join?

Read

Ruth 1:8-18; Hebrews 12:1; 1 Peter 4:8-10; Romans 8:28-30

Main Points

- 1. For Ruth, her decision boiled down to: Yahweh plus nothing in Bethlehem or everything minus Yahweh in Moab.
- 2. Stay in the story with God.
- 3. Stay in the story with People.
- 4. Stay in the story because God always writes a good ending.
- 5. Through pain, agony, and humiliation, through the grave, death and resurrection, Jesus stayed in the story for you.

Engage with God in a Group

- If your life is a story, what chapter do you think you're in and what title would you give it?
- What is a significant turning point in the story of your life?
- When you think of the main thoughts from this passage, what does it mean for you to "stay in the story with God" and "stay in the story with people"?
- What encouragement do you feel with the truth that God is with you in the story, writing it for you, and leading towards a good ending?

Bottom Line

You can stay in the story because Jesus is the one writing your story and he won't fail you nor will he leave you.
