Ice Breaker

Matthew 4:18-20; 1 John 2:6; Luke 6:40; Mark 3:14; Luke 19:10; John 20:21;

Main Points

- 1. Over the next 6 weeks, our focus is going to be on what it means for us to be sent to people.
- 2. Being called to Christ is inspiring, but being sent to people is intimidating.
- 3. Every time Jesus made a public declaration of his mission, it was a sign to his disciples following Jesus means that we are now a part of this mission.
- 4. The issue isn't in the how to, the issue is in the want to.
- 5. If we focus on just the greatness of the gospel, we will only celebrate. If we focus on the lostness of people, we will be overwhelmed and in despair. When these two realities collide in the depths of our soul, we will be baptized with a *want to* to share Christ.

Group Discussion

- Who was the first person to share with you about Jesus?
- When was the first time you remember starting a spiritual conversation with someone?
- Does our desire to share Christ overcome the barriers we have in front of us to sharing him?
- How would you respond to these two questions: 1) Do I really believe that the gospel is good news? And 2) Do I really believe that every person is lost apart from Christ?
- What's keeping you from sharing the good news with the people in your life?

Bottom Line

Being a disciple means that we are called to Christ and sent to people.

Write down 3 people who you believe are lost apart from Christ. Pray for yourself - that you really believe that the gospel is good news and that people are lost apart from Christ.
