Engaging with God in a Group

1. Pete summarized this passage in Daniel this way: For believers, it's going to be bad for a while, but will end great. For non-believers, it's going to be great for a while, but will end bad. What thoughts go through mind when you hear this?
2. The Anti-Christ will come. In [Revelation 13:8](#), we read that all who are not in the Lamb's Book of Life will worship the beast. Those whose names are in the Book of Life, will be delivered! Are you encouraged by this? How does this affect the way you see the time you have on this earth?
3. There are only two kinds of people in the world: (1) believers and (2) non-believers. There are two destinies for people: (1) everlasting life or (2) everlasting contempt. How have you lived aware of those around you who are believers or non-believers? Are you available and willing to be used by God to share Him with those around you?

Engaging with God Daily

Read [Daniel 12:3](#) and [Matthew 13:43](#). Write these two out on a notecard. Use this as a reminder of who you are in Christ – wise, made to shine. Christ uses us to bring others out of darkness into light - to God's Kingdom, where we will shine for ever and ever.

1. Spend some time praying for those you know who are non-believers. Pray they turn to Christ!
2. Pray for a sensitivity to the Spirit, to live aware of those around you and to see people as God sees them.
3. Are you available to be used by God to bring people out of darkness and into His Light?
