EUROPE

Christar - In Greece, *Nabeeb A.* founded Arab Center for Consulting and Training Services (ACCTS) and is regional director for the Arab world with Christar. His wife, *Ruba* is the founder of Arab Women Today and is the missionary coordinator for Christar.

Greater Europe Mission (GEM) - *Doug and Lisa Mitts* are engaged in GEM's "movement-model disciple-making" and church planting in the major urban centers of Europe to reach Europeans, multiplying disciples and growing Christ's church.

Helping Hands - Unable to return to work in Central Asia, *Ruth Dougherty* is working with Helping Hands in Athens, Greece serving refugees from that area. She hopes to train believers to teach spiritual truths to the children, as well as share in a small medical effort.

SEND International - In Bulgaria, *Scot and Robin Ullrich* provide theological education through teaching in a small Bible college, training Turkish-speaking Roma, and providing seminars for local churches.

SEND International - *Ron Redell* serves the Macedonia church through teaching, preaching, and starting an in-depth Bible training program where he builds up young men preparing for ministry. His wife, *Lisa* reaches out and serves families in the community, and leads Bible studies with women, teen girls, and children.

SEND International - *Andy and Nadine Spradley* seek to plant churches by inviting them to explore the Bible to see how Christ is the source of true life. In 2016, they began a temporary ministry offering humanitarian aid and the Gospel to Middle Eastern Muslim refugees who are passing through Macedonia on their way to Western Europe.

AFRICA

iAfrican Leadership and Reconciliation Ministries (ALARM) - *Celestin and Bernadette Musekura* founded ALARM, an African based and led organization, to equip leaders to transform their communities. ALARM trains leaders across East and Central Africa in biblical theology, conflict resolution, forgiveness, mediation, reconciliation, and leadership skills.

Christ's Family Church - *Mark and Sheryl O.* have worked with Teda (also known as Tubu, Toubou, and Tebu) people of Northern Chad, Eastern Niger and Southern Libya since 1998. A center, built in 2012, symbolizes their cultural ambitions, which is to support the Teda in their fight against Islamic fundamentalism/terrorism.

Hesed Ministries - *Michael and Florence Kyomya* founded Hesed Ministries in 1995 to be a catalyst for spiritual renewal and growth in the Anglican Church of Uganda. This includes evangelistic outreach, discipleship of new believers, and community development through a women's program, and pastoral and leadership training.

Pioneers - *John and Cynthia* opened a private language school in September 2016 as a way to build relationships among the Berbers of North Africa. The community is 99.99% Muslim and it is against the law to share one's faith in Christ. Despite the obstacles, the church is growing in number and maturity and they ask others join them in praying Colossians 1:9-11 over their life and work.

Sim (BRiCC) - In Jos, Nigeria, *Toby Abts* runs a community center called BRiCC (Building Relationships in City Center) to bring Muslims and Christians together to build relationships and experience the love of Christ. His wife, *Alycia* homeschools their son and serves on a few SIM Nigeria committees.

ASIA

Assist Network International (ANI) - Through ANI, *Jody and Barbara Crain* are connecting developmental resources with Asia's marginalized people groups in areas of sustainable business, community development and crisis response with a focus on taking the gospel to these people through long-term business ventures that contribute to the local economy. They also direct the Tagbanwa Training Center for tribal members living in deprived areas of Palawan, Philippines. They are also giving direction and training to New Tribes Missions' training centers, leadership teams, and consultants in all areas of Culture & Language Acquisition (CLA).

Christar - *LeeLing K.* has been in ministry among Persian-speakers in Central and Western Asia for close to 20 years. She started with ministering to marginalized children and their extended families and now works with refugees.

Christar - *Dorothy T.* is involved in building up and mobilizing house churches of the majority people to reach Muslims in East Asia and beyond. She is also involved in church planting among the Hui Muslims and providing counseling and member care.

Impact of Hope International - *Murli M.* is the founder and principle of the South Asian Institute for Leadership and Cultural Studies, which offers a 3-year program leading to a Bachelor of Theology degree with an emphasis on missions. He is also the founder and director of Impact International, which is involved in leadership training, church planting, and ministries to needy children. His wife, *Usha* is director of Humanitarian Services at Impact International. She is also involved in the rescue and nurture of high-risk children.

Iran Alive Ministries - *Hormoz Shariat*, founder of Iran Alive Ministries (IAM), uses media - satellite TV, social media, mobile technology, and internet; *Iranaliveministries.org* - to transform the lives of Iranian Muslims by the power of the gospel, and to plant underground house churches by identifying and investing in the lives of leaders. Hormoz and his wife *Donnell* believe that the Lord has used the Islamic rule to prepare Iran for a major revival and, by his grace, has uniquely positioned them to have a major impact in Iran and the Middle East for his kingdom.

Pioneers - *Teresa and Rob P.* have started a business consulting company in a restricted access country that allows for a Kingdom approach to ministry. They're working with a team that seeks to help spark and fuel an indigenous church planting movement in Central and East Asia. They reach out to locals in three languages through evangelism, discipleship, and mentoring of local majority-group believers so they can reach the Muslim minority group.

Pioneers - *Matthew M.* works in Southeast Asia to see movements occur among minority people groups on the island and among most people nationally.

REAP International - *Mazio and Rosemary Nakbro* train church planters and pastors in working on a holistic transformation of the people in Nagaland spiritually, educationally and politically.

South Asian Ministries - *Thomas and Mary Kutty's* vision is to spread the knowledge of the living God through preaching, social help, church planting, and their "Bible for every home" aspiration. The background and foundation of their ministry is intercessory prayer.

Crossover - *Daniel and Devri W.* have served as missionaries in the Middle East for more than 31 years planting churches among Muslims. They currently serve in the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus.

Cru Thailand- *Joe and Jana Crain* are on staff at Grace International School, which serves 575 students. Ninety percent of the students are missionary kids from 344 families who serve in 24 countries across Southeast Asia.

Cru Thailand - As spouse of Bent Tree's beloved *Enoch Sirkul*, *Laya* continues to carry on the ministries he led. The Thailand Evangelism and Church Growth Committee brought together the Church of Christ of Thailand, the Evangelical Fellowship of Thailand, and the Baptist Convention of Thailand, which developed a plan to reach every Thai by the gospel and a church established in every province and district of Thailand. They also work to prepare a new generation of leaders through the "iServe" program which motivates young people to serve in their local churches and communities.

World Venture - *Gerry and Maria Schroeder*, based in Moscow, Russia, mentor pastors, worship leaders, songwriters and musicians of key churches that inspire an additional 2000 churches using *RussiaWorship.org* to fully engage their hearts with God. In turn, these inspired churches are reaching into their communities and impacting lives.

USA

Arabic Church of Dallas and World Refugee Care - *Jalil Dawood (wife, Sundus)* pastors the Arabic Church of Dallas. He also helps refugees and immigrants from the Middle East rebuild and their lives spiritually and physically focusing on pointing people to the Gospel of Christ.

Athletes in Action (Cru) - *Bryan Dobkins (wife Emily)* works the SportLinc department of the Athletes in Action campus ministries to disciple and train college athletes in their faith on campuses that do not currently have an AIA staff member. He coordinates Student Athlete Leadership Team (SALT) training with student leaders to promote sustainability of the ministry on their campus so they can grow where they are and go where they are not.

Christar - *Tamara Soderstrom* mobilizes and mentors people to think critically about their role in fulfilling the Great Commission. As a mentor she walks alongside them when they take those next steps - learning more about missions, praying for the world, giving to the global cause, or going to serve on the mission field.

Cru - *Johnathan and Stephanie Duggins* make videos about people and places transformed by the Gospel. By telling stories about what God is doing the world, they hope to connect people in the US with opportunities to get involved with global missions.

Cru - As Director of Ministry Leadership of Cru in the USA, *Mike and Susie Duggins* focus on coaching ministry leaders and raising up resources for major outreach and humanitarian projects in the US and around the world. Lately, their focus has been on helping Cru Military expand their outreach efforts. They have also been assisting the Cru humanitarian ministry in meeting physical needs and sharing Christ with Syrian refugees.

Cru - *Doug and Ev Harris* have been on staff with Cru living and working in 91 countries for 30 years. For 20 years, they have been with the Jesus Film Project, a ministry of Cru, in Orlando, Florida, helping with the completion and distribution of 1,400 new Jesus Film languages. They have also worked to provide internet app access to 209 countries in 1,233 languages.

Cru - Realizing that the decisions students make set the direction of their lives, the focal point of *Ward and Gwen Schmeidel's* vision is college students. The lives of these students will influence the lives of others for many years. As the leaders of tomorrow - for better or worse, Ward and Gwen want to reach them for Christ.

East West Ministries - *Alex* translated the "Bible Training Center for Pastors" (BTCP) church leader and pastor training curriculum into Spanish. For 17 years Alex and Lily traveled to Cuba to train national church leaders in Biblical principles, concepts, and truth. Their ministry is now focused on equipping leaders of Cuban-American churches in the United States as well as prison ministry in Denton County, Texas.

East West Ministries - For more than 30 years, *Diane and Bryan Thomas* have been part of church planting and leadership training in the Philippines, Russia, and Central Asia. During typhoon disaster relief in the Philippines in 2014, Diane began Humanity to provide a home, food, education and spiritual nurturing for abandoned children and adult survivors living on the streets. Diane continues her ministry of teaching and training women in mentoring and discipleship programs in the Philippines and the country of Georgia.

Faculty Commons (Cru) - Unfortunately, many professors who mold and shape the minds of the students they teach do not favor Christian morals and values. *Peter and Patti Culver's* goal is to reach professors with the gospel of Christ so that students will have an opportunity to learn under a professor who truly follows Christ.

Global Aid Network (GAIN) (Cru) - Using their Tajik and Russian language skills, *Ryan and Angela Grammier* serve as the GAIN Field Strategy Representative for Tajikistan and other parts of Central Asia. They work with Cru staff in Central Asia to provide humanitarian aid that will best help further the gospel.

Inner City Cru - *Paul & Betsy Lucido* work with Cru Inner City which partners with urban churches committed to ministering to the whole person. They help churches connect with people in need by providing relief products, like clothing and blankets, to the homeless, new shoes for back to school, and holiday meals for families. They empower urban churches through training, manpower, and other resources helping them to minister well to men, women, and children at their point of need. They also have developmental programs to equip their partners to bring deep and lasting transformation to their neighborhoods. They serve throughout the 12 counties of the Dallas/Fort Worth metroplex.

International Commission - *Sam and Valetta Buliga* develop relationships with national leaders and missionaries to reach Eastern Europe and Central Asia with the gospel of Christ. They also teach and equip leaders with the biblical methods of evangelism and encourage them to disciple new believers.

International School Project (Cru) - *Dave and Beth Wiley* work with The International School Project, a division of Cru, equips and mobilizes teachers of elementary public school throughout the world to take the gospel to their students at a time when they are most open to hearing it.

International Students, Inc. (ISI) - *Kent and Judy Marshall* work with international students to build genuine friendships, share Christ's love, help Christian students grow in faith and learn how to serve God after they graduate.

New Churches, Inc. - *Tom and Teresa Haralson* have been planting churches in Southeastern Louisiana since 1990. They are currently planting a Spanish-speaking church in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, where Tom serves as the mentoring pastor. He also serves as an elder and ESL teacher. Teresa serves in outreach to the multi-cultural community.

Responder Impact - *Randy Creech* serves as the Frisco Fire and Police Chaplain with Responder Impact, (*responderimpact.org*) which was launched in 2011. Randy addresses the unique spiritual and emotional needs of first responders. He seeks to encourage first responders in a life-giving relationship with Jesus, equip them to enjoy that relationship, and empower them to live it out at home, work, and in their community.

RREACH International - *Ramesh and Bonnie Richard*. RREACH is a proclamation ministry seeking to change the way one billion individuals think and hear about Jesus Christ. They utilize personal proclamation, media outreach, and ministry training to evangelize opinion leaders, strengthen pastoral leaders, and reach large numbers of individuals from Asia, Africa, and Latin America.

Shepherd Project - *Stacey Tuttle* serves as Director of Shepherd Project Ministries (SPM) which focuses on helping followers of Jesus to maximize their impact on the world. Their goal is to encourage Christians of every tradition to share the gospel of Jesus Christ and to live as God intended so that those in their sphere of influence are drawn to and come to understand the truth.

SIM - Along with her husband, *Naomi Leenhouts* served in Africa for almost 20 years. She has now returned with her children to the U.S. following her husband's passing, and she continues to serve God in the Great Commission with SIM. She is involved in member care for missionaries as they return to the U.S.A. for home assignment. Pray for wisdom, discernment, and vision as she works with families that will return to the field.

SIM - *Ed and Rita Moran* are the Regional Directors for the SIM Rocky Mountain region. As directors they oversee church relations and mobilization, new ministry facilitating and training, missionary care and development and strategic planning.

Village of Hope - Uganda - *Cindy Cunningham* with Village of Hope (VOH) rescues children who are former child soldiers, sex slaves or children orphaned by war. This is accomplished with their feeding ministry in Gulu's former IDP (Internally Displaced Persons). Residential Villages of Hope provide physical needs, education and vocational training, a loving home, and Biblical discipleship to address epidemic poverty and hopelessness among Uganda's most vulnerable children.

Village of Hope - Uganda - *Terrie Robinson* with Village of Hope (VOH) rescues children and their siblings who are former child soldiers, sex slaves, or orphaned by war. VOH provides safety, medical services, a loving home, education, counseling, and systemic solutions to epidemic poverty and hopelessness among Africa's most vulnerable children.

Wycliffe - *Rick and Melanie Floyd* worked for 26 years in Peru translating the New Testament into the Wanca Quechua language. Now Rick teaches linguistic principles of language organization to graduate students at Biola University in La Mirada, CA. He also continues to work with Wycliffe as a long-distance consultant for the Wanca Quechua translation team working on translating the Old Testament.
